



MAFES Multistate Project Travel Awards Request for Proposals

To encourage participation by MSU scientists in multistate research projects, the MAFES Director will annually reserve a pool of resources to support costs associated with travel to multistate regional research project annual meetings. Up to 30 travel awards will be made annually to support travel expenses not to exceed \$2,000/meeting for scientists formally participating in a CRIS multistate research project and traveling to the annual multistate project meeting. **Please note that only multistate *research* projects are eligible for these awards. Multistate Extension and Research Activities (ERAs designated as SERAXX, NERAXX, NCERAXX, or WERAXX) are not eligible.**

Requests will be made to the Director's office, through the faculty member's department head. Multistate Travel Award proposals can be submitted throughout the annual cycle and will be awarded on a first-come basis, subject to confirmation of participation in the Multistate Project.
