A formula blend of double-flowered zinnias, changing colors of marigolds, contrasting colors in flowers of Calibrachoa (million bells), plus variegated foliage and multicolored flowers of an ornamental milkweed have provided attractive spring displays in the Trial Gardens.



Double Zahara® Brilliant Mixture zinnias (above), a seed-grown mix from PanAmerican Seed, will be available for gardens in 2017. In past years, the Double Zahara® zinnias have always been dependable for warm-weather color and disease resistance in our Trial Gardens.

French marigold 'Strawberry Blonde' (below), from PanAmerican Seed, produces flowers that change color as they mature. The transition in flower color (which can also include burnt orange, tangerine, and salmon shades) is slower in cooler weather, so this variety is best used in early spring and fall plantings. With the arrival of warmer weather in our region, golden yellow flowers currently predominate on plants in the Trial Gardens.
