To welcome the arrival of spring, our K-L-M trio of delicious and easy-to-grow All-America Selections (AAS) award-winning vegetables are performing extra duty as showy ornamentals in a raised salad table. The salad table was built by the Pine Belt Master Gardeners and works great year-round for gardeners of all ages.

Kohlrabi 'Konan'

Kohlrabi 'Konan' produces a bulbous stem that can be sliced or diced. This 2016 AAS winner can also be enjoyed up close for its out-of-this-world look.

Lettuce 'Sandy'

'Sandy' is a 2015 AAS winner with lots of tasty, oakleaf-type leaves on attractive, uniform, mounded plants that are disease resistant and slow to bolt. Mizuna 'Red Kingdom'

A 2016 AAS winner, mizuna (Japanese mustard) 'Red Kingdom' has a mild flavor and provides a showy display with its dark-colored leaves.
