From cools blends of green and deep crimson to a flaming combination of red and yellow to almost every imaginable color combination, coleus offer a kaleidoscope of foliage colors, along with a range of plant forms and leaf sizes. Years ago, coleus were grown mainly in the shade garden, but breeders have made coleus a favorite crop for full sun use in both landscapes and containers. Today, we feature just a few of the best performers from our 2018 in-ground and container trials. You can look for these varieties from Proven Winners and Terra Nova Nurseries as plants in garden centers next spring.
